Rev. Dr. Lisa Maxine Goods is a pastor, preacher, teacher, scholar, chaplain, womanist, and justice-seeker. Rev. Goods was ordained by the United Church of Christ in February 2011. She served Covenant United Church of Christ in South Holland, Illinois as Associate Pastor of Outreach and Communications for over 11 years. During this time, Dr. Goods established a Single Parents' Ministry, a Prayer Ministry, served as editor of the church's newsletter, implemented the church's social media presence and mobile app, worked extensively in youth ministry, and served as Pastoral Liaison for the Health and Wellness and Singles Ministries. From 2014 to 2018 Dr. Goods served as Director of Community Life for Chicago Theological Seminary overseeing worship and facilitating campus spiritual, professional and community formation. She also served as Senior Pastor of Kenwood United Church of Christ in Chicago from 2017 to 2019. From 2019-2020 Rev. Goods completed a one-year chaplain residency at ChristianCare Health System in Newark, Delaware, providing pastoral care and counseling to acute care, trauma, and addiction patients including caring for COVID19 patients and staff.

Rev. Goods is a lover of music and has a passion for women, youth, and social justice. She is the daughter of Cassandra Jones and the late Richard Goods, Sr. and the mother of one son, Julian James Goods. Most of all she loves God and has a heart for the people of God.
